Home	Limited to 10 persons, excluding Solemnizer and vendors (kept to a minimum).	<p><u>Use of face masks/shields</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bride & groom may wear face shields instead of face masks, and can be unmasked for key moments (e.g. when exchanging vows, rings, kiss) as long as they maintain safe distance of at least 2m from others when unmasked. • Masks may be momentarily removed for photo-taking. <p><u>Ensuring adherence to safe management measures</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Couples are to declare their guest and vendor list to the Solemnizer at least one day before the solemnization • Solemnizer may postpone solemnization if safe management measures are not adhered to before / during solemnization • Couple and home owner/occupant to ensure adherence to safe management measures. 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Places of worship	<p>Limited to 50 persons (or the venue capacity, whichever is lower), excluding Solemnizers, religious and supporting workers and vendors (kept to a minimum).</p> <p>50 persons to consist of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Up to 20 persons 'wedding party' which includes the bride and groom and the couple's two witnesses Remaining guests split into fixed groups of up to 5 persons each 	<p><u>Interactions between groups</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1m distance should be maintained between the 'wedding party' and other groups of up to 5 persons, and 1m distance between groups of 5. Where guests are seated, these should be fixed. No interactions between the groups. No intermingling between 'wedding party' (including bride & groom) and all other guests – e.g. no receiving / sending-off guests upon arrival/departure. <p><u>Use of face masks/shields</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bride & groom may wear face shields instead of face masks, and can be unmasked for key moments (e.g. when exchanging vows, rings, kiss) as long as they maintain safe distance of at least 2m from others when unmasked. Masks may be momentarily removed for photo-taking. Event emcees and people / religious workers making speeches or sermons on stage may wear face shields instead of a mask, and must maintain at least 1m distance from any other individual. They should wear a mask when off the stage. <p><u>Other guidelines</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No food and beverages allowed at solemnization. No live performances or activities involving singing, loud talking or shouting. <p><u>Ensuring adherence to safe management measures</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Couples are to declare their guest and vendor list to the Solemnizer at least one day before the solemnization Solemnizer may postpone solemnization if safe management measures are not adhered to before / during solemnization Couple and Religious Organisation to ensure adherence to safe management measures. 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<p>Other premises (e.g. hotels, restaurants, country clubs, HDB and condo common areas)</p>	<p>Limited to 50 persons (or the venue capacity, whichever is lower), excluding Solemnizers, vendors and premises staff (kept to a minimum).</p> <p>50 persons to consist of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Up to 20 persons 'wedding party' which includes the bride and groom and the couple's two witnesses Remaining guests split into fixed groups of up to 5 persons each <p>Premises owners may determine if they want to allow receptions to be carried out in their premises, and may set a lower limit for attendance based on their capacity.</p>	<p><u>Interactions between groups</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1m distance between the 'wedding party' and other 5pax groups, and 1m distance between 5pax groups. Where guests are seated, these should be fixed. No freestanding activities and interactions between the groups. No intermingling between 'wedding party' (including bride & groom) and all other guests – e.g. no table-to-table photos, face-to-face greeting at arrival/departure. <p><u>Use of face masks/shields</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bride & groom may wear face shields instead of face masks, and can be unmasked for key moments (e.g. when exchanging vows, rings, kiss) as long as they maintain safe distance of at least 2m from others when unmasked. They should seek advice from relevant authorities if they have queries.</p> <p>Wedding receptions should be held no more than 12 months after the solemnization.</p> <p><u>Attendance limits (for receptions)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Limited to 50 persons (or lower depending on venue capacity and/or policy), excluding vendors and premises staff (to be kept to minimum required). 50 persons to consist of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Up to 20 persons 'wedding party' which includes the bride and groom Remaining guests split into fixed groups of up to 5 persons each Premises owners may determine if they want to allow receptions to be carried out in their premises, and may set a lower limit for attendance based on their capacity. <p><u>Interactions between groups</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Limited to 50 persons, excluding vendors and premises staff. There can be a 'wedding party' of up to 20 persons, including the bride and groom. All other guests to be in fixed groups of 5, and where guests are seated, these should be fixed. 1m distance between the 'wedding party' and other 5 persons groups, and 1m distance between 5 persons groups. No freestanding activities and interactions between the groups (e.g. pre-meal reception). No intermingling between 'wedding party' (including bride & groom) and all other guests – e.g. no table-to-table photos, face-to-face greeting at arrival/departure. <p><u>Use of face masks/shields</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendees may remove their masks for meals, and should put on their masks immediately after eating. Masks may be momentarily removed for photo-taking. Event emcees and people making speeches on stage may wear face shields instead of a mask, and must maintain at least 1m distance from any other individual. They should wear a mask when off the stage. <p><u>Food and Beverages</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No self-service buffets or sharing dishes/platters. Food to be individually packed/plated. Attendees should not share cups/ cutlery/ utensils. No sale or consumption of alcohol after 10.30pm.

- Adopt contactless modes of operation where possible e.g. putting the seating arrangements online or on a board instead of a manned reception counter to minimise contact between individuals.

Other guidelines

- No live singing performances or activities involving singing, loud talking or shouting.
- Other cultural rites (e.g. tea ceremony) may be held as part of the reception, within the “wedding party”.
- No pre-wedding reception to avoid bunching.
- All guests should check in to the event using SafeEntry. The venue owner/ operator or organisers should have a unique QR code for the event space, e.g. hotel ballroom, function room, private dining room in a restaurant.
- All guests should download and activate TraceTogether before attending the event. Checks should be performed to ensure that TraceTogether has been activated e.g. at the point of checking that the attendee has checked in via SafeEntry.
- Stagger the arrival and departure timings of attendees to discourage queueing in groups
- Adopt contactless modes of operation where possible e.g. putting the seating arrangements online or on a board instead of a manned reception counter to minimise contact between individuals.

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
